CALL TO ORDER:

After a discussion the motion was passed with the corrections made and the stipulation that the new council will re-open the budget when council resumes. All aye.
- Forest McClintock made the motion to exonerate the Borough from the tax liability for 2014 and 2015 of the flood properties purchased from the buyout. Gary Steinruck seconded the motion. All aye. Gary Steinruck made the motion to request equitable relief from the Southern Area School District or paying the 2014 and 2015 school taxes on the flood properties purchased from the buyout. Columbia County has already exonerated the Borough on the county taxes for these years. Joe Benware seconded the motion. All aye.
